CHALLENGE STAGES



The program, promoted by CorLab in collaboration with the Smart City and Digital Transformation Department, was carried out between June and December 2024 across three stages: the call for proposals, evaluation and selection and implementation.

CALL FOR PROPOSALS & APPLICATIONS (JUNE - JULY)

The initiative opened its call for young entrepreneurs, startups and organizations with innovative sustainability-focused ideas. To support the process, an information session was held with stakeholders from the academic, business and social sectors, providing details about the challenge and its objectives. A total of 19 applications were received.

EVALUATION & SELECTION (AUGUST)

An evaluation committee, composed of 19 leaders from the public, private, academic and third sectors, analyzed the submitted proposals. The selection was carried out by representatives from companies, environmental organizations, universities and government agencies who assessed each initiative based on its impact, feasibility and level of innovation.

RECOGNITION DAY (SEPTEMBER 2024)

The official presentation of the selected solutions took place in the Globant La Docta auditorium, with the presence of local government officials, representatives of the entrepreneurial ecosystem and leaders of organizations. The event was attended by Mayor Daniel Passerini, Deputy Major Javier Pretto, councilors and other municipal authorities.

The eight winning teams presented their solutions to an audience of more than 200 people, including entrepreneurs, government officials and leaders from the private, academic and social sector. This event not only showcased the projects' innovative potential but also reinforced the commitment of the community and public sector to their development and scalability.





OPEN DATA FOR FOOD SECURITY

<u>Ciampagna & Asociados</u> together with Fundación Innova Comunidad (Innova Comunidad Foundation) developed an interactive simulator that leverages open data and artificial intelligence to anticipate the impacts of climate change on food and nutrition security ('SAN', for its acronym in Spanish). This tool transforms complex data into dashboards, interactive maps and clear simulations, helping decision-makers design public policies tailored to local needs.

CITY CHARGE: CHARGING STATION FOR URBAN ELECTRIC MICROMOBILITY

A study on electric micromobility carried out by a team of young people from the **Universidad Católica de Córdoba** (Catholic University of Córdoba) in collaboration with **Cofactory**, provides an in-depth analysis of the profile and needs of **electric skateboard** users in the city. The study identified key usage areas, surveyed user characteristics and outlined the main challenges. Based on this **survey**, a proposal was presented for a sustainable charging station powered by IoT technology, an innovative solution aimed at encouraging electric micromobility, improving urban connectivity and contributing to a cleaner and more efficient environment.

SABOR CIRCULAR: BACK TO DISPOSABLE CONTAINERS

Sabor Circular is a sustainable solution developed by Ecolink that introduces a reusable packaging system in the food sector in Nueva Córdoba. Through a digital platform, it connects responsible consumers with participating establishments, significantly reducing single-use waste promoting more sustainable habits. This model, which combines technological innovation with social alliances, represents a transformative change in urban waste management.



La Biocleta is a circular economy solution that connects sustainable mobility with composting. This system collects organic waste from cafés in Córdoba's historic center using electric bicycles and transforms it into compost, which is then used to nourish trees and reforest green spaces in the city.


